

Title/Position:	Wonder Camp Leader
Reports to:	Program Coordinator
General Responsibilities:	Camp Leaders are responsible for creating a meaningful camp experience through the daily activities of Wonder Camps for children aged 4-10 by leading age-appropriate, theme-based activities that promote positive growth and intentional learning.

Duties will include but are not limited to:

- Going out of your way to create a meaningful experience for campers and their adults
- Ensuring Wonder Camp expectations are met at the highest level, including facilitation of projects/demonstrations, free play periods, lunchtime and snack coverage, and drop-off and release
- Oversee the direction and organization of campers during activities, games, projects/demonstrations, and play.
- Direct and assign Wonder Guides to camp duties
- Ensuring successful drop-off and release of campers
- Be a role model for campers and camp staff in attitude and behavior
- Represent Wonder Camp when interacting with parents and members of the community
- Communicate concerns, updates, and challenges to Program Coordinator regularly
- Communicate any day-to-day information to campers' adults as necessary
- Setting up all necessary equipment and materials for daily camp activities
- Other duties as assigned

Required Skills:

- 1. High school diploma and 3 or more years' experience in a similar position; Post-secondary education in early education or related field preferred
- 2. Experience working with children aged 4-10
- 3. Knowledge of camp activities, songs, and games preferred
- 4. Understanding of the developmental needs of children
- 5. Commitment to actively engaging and interacting with young learners and their adults
- 6. High comfort level working with children in a fast-paced, high-traffic, public environment
- 7. Ability to provide clear and effective communication to other camp staff
- 8. Views children as capable and competent and recognizes that children learn naturally through play
- 9. Ability to genuinely communicate with diverse guests of all backgrounds and abilities
- 10. Ability to respond to urgent/emergency situations in a calm, comforting manner
- 11. Ability to independently manage and prioritize several tasks efficiently and with ease
- 12. Reliable, flexible, and able to work cooperatively with other camp and museum staff members as a positive team player
- 13. A strong commitment to the mission, vision, and values of WCM

Essential Physical Functions: On any given day, may be frequently required to do one or more of the following: climbing, stooping, kneeling, crouching, crawling, reaching, lifting up to 25 pounds and moving short distances
