Level I Assistant Camp Guides who are outgoing, adaptable and sensibly silly. The Assistant Camp Guide will support the Camp Lead in providing a positive, high quality experience for all campers and their families. This is a seasonal position, running from May 27th-August 2nd, with the week of July 4th off. This position requires availability Monday-Friday from 8:30am-4:30pm.

Duties will include but are not limited to:

- 1. Create a memorable experience for all campers by providing a welcoming, engaging, and fun environment.
- 2. Assist with preparing daily activities and projects to ensure each program is thoughtfully presented, organized, and executed.
- Create an upbeat, positive atmosphere where campers feel open to explore, try new things, test their knowledge and get messy in the Camp classroom and on the exhibit floor.
- 4. Follow Wonderscope's positive classroom management philosophy and assist in leading a class of up to 25 campers.
- 5. Treat each child with respect and consider the needs of each child as an individual, meeting them at their own level.
- 6. Proactively, quickly and professionally respond to challenging or stressful situations like spills, accidents, camper behavior, etc.
- 7. Assist in daily set-up, cleaning and maintenance duties of the camp classrooms, check-in/out support, play time and lunch supervision
- 8. Other duties as assigned.

Required Skills:

- 1. Must be 16 years of age
- 2. Experience working with children of all ages
- 3. Knowledge of camp games, songs and activities or experience working in a camp setting
- 4. Commitment to teamwork and creating an excellent Wonder Camp experience

- 5. High comfort level working with children in a fast-paced, high-traffic, public environment
- 6. Views children as capable and competent and recognizes that children learn naturally through play
- 7. Ability to genuinely communicate with diverse guests of all backgrounds and abilities
- 8. Ability to respond to camper needs and urgent/emergency situations in a calm, comforting manner
- 9. Reliable, flexible, and able to work cooperatively with other camp and museum staff as a positive team player

Functions: On any given day, may be frequently required to do one or more of the following: climbing, stooping, kneeling, crouching, crawling, reaching, lifting up to 25 pounds and moving short distances
